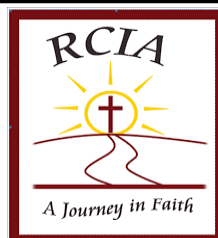

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Synodality & Eucharist Revival (III)

PULPIT

The name pulpit was taken from the theatrical performance arena. It was a kind of stage..."Pulpitum" a raised platform in the Nave of the church used primarily for preaching & teaching.

In the 1500's, after the reformation, pulpits became a central feature in protestant churches and its use in Catholic churches declined and was replaced by the lectern. By the 19th century, the lectern was a common feature in the Catholic church. Since the lectern was movable, it was carried in and taken out as needed. Usually brought in for the readings and homilies and taken out for the rest of the liturgy.

GERM: General Instructions on the Roman Missal says that the lectern or pulpit or ambo needs to be fixed (stationary) and located in such a way that Lectors (Readers), Cantors and Clergy are clearly visible and audible to all congregants (those gathered) and to be used for:

- Readings
- Responsorial Psalm
- Proclaiming the Exultet
- Homily
- Universal Prayers

In our churches we now have a fixed lectern or ambo with steps for reading sacred scripture and preaching (teaching). The choir uses movable lecterns for music.

ALTER

Church altars come in all shapes and sizes, depending on the design or architecture of the church, and are made of either wood, brick, or stone.

On the altar, the celebration of the Mystery of the Eucharist takes place. The early Christian community (early church) did not have temples or churches. The Eucharist was done in individual homes and the kitchen or dining table was the altar. With the passage of time, churches were built, and wooden altars were erected in the Apse. What is an Apse? Apse is the semicircle or polygonal recess at the end of the sanctuary. It is a vaulted recess or semi-circular dome. As time passed the wooden altars were replaced by stone or marble altars, with the relics of saints placed beneath them. In the Middle Ages, the church had side altars so that multiple Masses could be celebrated simultaneously.

On the altars the following items were/are placed for the celebration of the Eucharist:

- Alter cloths (with the color of the season)
- A small cross or crucifix
- A paten for the large host
- A ciborium for the small host
- A chalice for the wine
- 2 cruets (or jugs), one for wine, another for water
- A book of Prayers (Sacramentary)
- A corporal - on which sits the chalice and ciborium
- A purificator - to purify the chalice and ciborium
