



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Liturgy of the Word

We come now to the liturgy of the word, and before we go any further, let's pause a moment and ask ourselves what we mean by celebrating the liturgy. Liturgy is a public ritual of worship. It's a communal response to and a participation in sacred or holy activities using praise, thanksgiving, remembrance, supplication, and repentance.

Liturgy creates a basis for establishing a relationship with the Lord God. It's a formal ritual enacted by those who seek participation in an action with the Divine. So, we have the Liturgy of the Eucharist, Liturgy or the word and Liturgy of the hours. The word liturgy comes from the Greek word LEITOURGIA which is really two words. Leitos meaning people or public and Ergon meaning work or service. Letourgia is a public service for the people.

Next question! What does it mean to celebrate liturgy? Well, let's see! To celebrate anything, small or large, quietly alone or raucously in a crowd, or even solemnly in worship is to take "time" to notice, to be aware, to appreciate little moments or big moments in life. Blessed moments. Talents. Abilities. Skills. Persistence that finally pays off etc.

Moments of celebration make us pause and become mindful of those little things that make life worth living. Celebrations also boost our sense of wellbeing. They give us a buffer against the bad moments, the difficult moments, and help us build resilience against stress and stressful situations. When you look forward to something worth celebrating you feel more optimistic about life. Therefore, it behooves us to notice those moments. To step out of routines even if it's just for a few moments. Notice differences. Commemorate them. Offer gratitude for them. "Now take all of that and apply it to liturgy." Celebrate liturgy.

Those who pay attention will recall a homily I gave on "Time". I said that time can be perceived in two ways. 1. As Chronos and 2. As Kairos. Now, Chronos gives us chronology as a sequence of events. This is the sequential time. History. Kairos is the moment of significance. Moments of significant events. This is the appointed time. You may ask, appointed for what? Decisive moment. Moment of decision, fulfilment etc. Appointed for that which matters.

We can therefore perceive history as a chronology of events (History), or as significant moments of grace or occasions of decisions... Rites of passage, decisive moments in life. You have not doubt heard the phrase "those who do not remember history are condemned to repeat it.

The bible keeps reminding us that our individual lives are marked by reminders in which God urges us to return to Godself. To Encounter God. To Repent. To Believe. Our lives, therefore, have moments in which the heart is rent open, and the Lord God comes into it and makes a huge difference in our lives.

The Second Vatican Council, the Constitution on Sacred Liturgy, says in part, "In the earthly liturgy by way of foretaste we share in the heavenly liturgy, which is celebrated in the Holy city, Jerusalem, towards which we journey as pilgrims and in which Christ is sitting at the right hand of God, a minister of the Sanctuary and the true tabernacle." This heavenly liturgy shapes history, (Chronos) events in time; it vitalizes the church in "space-time" (Our world) and therefore salvation history is turned into liturgy (Kairos). Decisive moments in which God comes with power (dynamic), and this coming is the sole concern of those who answer God's call.

In celebrating the liturgy, we focus on Christ such that each moment becomes a moment of Grace. Liturgy cannot be lived at each moment unless it is celebrated are certain moments. Aah! Read it again! We celebrate the event of Christ which then becomes the event of the church gathered; gathered here and now, in this moment. We, here on earth, welcome the heavenly liturgy and participate in it.

Another question! Are there distractions in liturgy? Oh, yes, definitely! Some distractions are external, and others and others are internal (from within us). Distractions come in all forms and at any time...Boredom, poor homilies, unprepared ministers, off-key tunes, coughs sand throat clearings, freezing or hot sanctuary...etc., all are a constant cause of distractions. So, how do we mitigate these situations?

Be prepared! Ward them off by whatever means necessary. Always strive to remember that you share in a wondrous communion with the heavenly liturgy. In our Eucharist with those heavenly warriors and warrioresses, saints and angels. They have our back against those distractions. We may be totally earthly but as we fight those distractions, we know we have resources and help available from the heavenly choir. Be prepared. Be aware. Keep calm and keep celebrating the liturgy.
