The Door

In order to get to the worship space, one has to enter through the door or doors depending on the architecture of the church. So, what awaits you behind the doors? The body and blood of the one who says to you in John 14:6 "I am the way, the truth and the life." You'll also find other members of the body of Christ, your brothers and sisters.

Jesus also says, "I am the door". John 10:7. The ministerial functions of the church are done by those ordained or installed. The church has orders, that is, people ordained or installed to carry out certain functions during liturgy. Let's go down memory lane... in the past there were minor orders and major orders. The minor orders were porter or door keeper, exorcist, lector, and acolyte. Major orders were subdeacon, deacon, priest, and bishop.

The porter was the door keeper, responsible for opening and closing doors of the church, also guarding the door during the celebration of the Mass. Pope Paul VI suppressed the minor orders and Vatican II opened those functions to the laity and so now we have ushers, lectors, and extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist. One came to the minor orders through ordination but now any members of the church can be blessed or installed to perform these offices.

In the seminary, orders are still used as a process towards ordination to priesthood and episcopate. Seminaries install lectors and acolytes. Others, like porter and subdeacon were suppressed. Deacons took on the functions of subdeacon.

Let's return to our door. Some churches have ornate doors. Others have simple doors. There are doors with stained glass, others with frescos. John 10:9 says, "I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture." As you enter the door, ask yourself, what is it that Jesus says He will save me from? Who opened the door for me? How did I come to the faith? Did a parent, a friend, a grandparent open the doors for me? Well, be that as it may, the door to our faith is like a life jacket of our lives. It's something we need to cherish because our spiritual lives depend upon our salvation, as John tells us in his gospel.

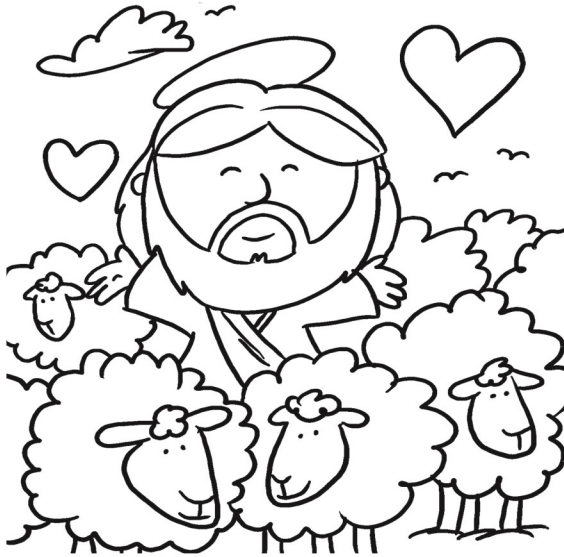

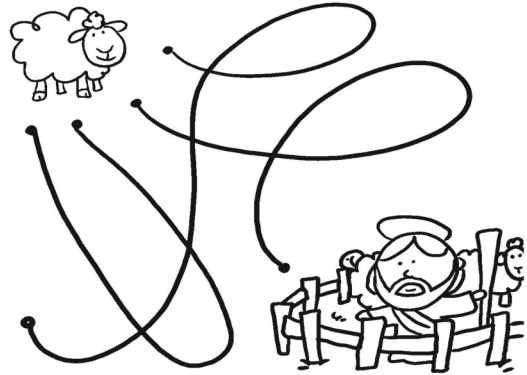

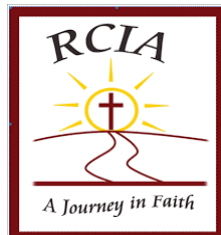
