DISPENSATION TO EAT MEAT ON SAINT PATRICK'S DAY – During the season of Lent, Catholics (age 14 and older) should abstain from eating meat on Fridays. This ancient practice of the Church challenges us to eat more simply on Fridays and also to practice more generosity to our neighbors. Penance is supposed to strengthen the whole community.

This year, Saint Patrick's Day (March 17) falls on a Friday in Lent. In Ireland, Australia, Canada, and the United States, it has become customary for church leaders to grant a dispensation to allow people to celebrate this important day in a festive way. Church Law gives pastors the ability to grant this dispensation to members of a local parish community.

I hereby dispense the parishioners of St. Ann's from the obligation to abstain from meat on St. Patrick's Day, 2023. I encourage everyone to select another day of the week to refrain from eating meat on a personal basis. And, as you fast, please pray for our Food Pantry ministry this year, which directly serves hungry children and adults in our neighborhood.

LOOKING FORWARD IN LENT – Here are some reminders and details about some things that are coming up in the next few weeks, as we move toward Holy Week and Easter:

- Evening of Reflection: Drawing Closer to God Thursday, March 30, 7:00pm in the Worship Space. We will gather to pray and reflect on our Lenten journey in the final days of preparation for Holy Week. All are welcome to this gentle, calm time of community and prayer.
- Chrism Mass The annual Diocesan Chrism Mass will be at the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in Richmond on Monday, April 3 at 6:00pm. Although attendance has been restricted in recent years because of the pandemic, this year all are welcome. - Rice Bowls Are you collecting change in your Lenten Rice Bowl? Almsgiving is part of our traditional Lenten practices, and all Rice Bowl funds will go to Catholic Relief Services to assist in their ministries abroad. We will collect your Rice Bowls after Easter. In particular, bring your Rice Bowl to Mass on the first Sunday after Easter (April 15 & 16, Divine Mercy Sunday) and we will invite everyone to bring their bowl to the altar during Mass, at the Preparation.
